 - Status of big rig

 - i. Truck logos- Joy says logos weren't put on the trailer and we accepted money. She had asked Julie to contact the companies who donated money. Mr. Pearce says we need to get logos started much earlier for next year. Start now and honor the ones from last year for next year. Get all sponsors done before next year and print all logos on one sheet before the beginning of football season. Set a deadline for around August 1st depending on how long it takes to print the sheet. Sam Draper suggested having flyers at Megaband for parents to begin soliciting donations. Chris Rylant suggested having some more fundraisers to help raise money to supplement sponsorships. She suggests forming a fundraising committee. Put in Band Buzz looking for interest in being on the committee and advertise at Megaband. More parents are needed as volunteers. We need to reach out to parents during events where more parents are present. Sam Draper stated that raising more money can help with band fees amounts which are increasing each year. Chris Rylant volunteered to talk to parents at Megaband.

- 3. Committee reports for last month activities.
 - a. Poinsettias Sales Joy King reported that about \$1700 raised.

b. Butter Braid Sales – Joy King reported that about \$1,600 was raised.

Mattress was a whole lot less than last year. Poinsettia and Butterbraids were better fundraisers. Mr. Pearce indicated that if orchestra does with fundraiser next year we will participate. It does not require any work from the band.

- 4. Committee reports for upcoming activities
 - a. Bites at the Lake Feb 15th Larry Rupp

Larry went to restaurants and got 7 yeses. In the past there were usually about 20 restaurants. Larry will work on getting more restaurants and will follow up with the ones he talked to. We need to have closer to 15 places.

Tickets will cost about \$25 each. Price may change depending on the number of restaurants. Larry needs volunteers to help reach out to restaurants. Chris Rylant is working on getting bids for the banquet and will look at who did Bites at the Lake in the past.

- b. Band Banquet May 10th (6pm- 10pm)— Chris Rylant- UHCL has penciled us in for May 10th. They can't host for free so the cost to have the banquet at UHCL will be \$800. The theme is Greco Roman and Chris is looking into Italian Restaurants. Chris is trying to save money on decorations by borrowing decorations. Parents will organize food, decorations and band video. Kids take care of everything else. Seniors get a book and cookies with their names (Senior gift), Mr. Pearce takes care of awards. Seniors eat for free. Banquet attendees are mostly kids and senior parents. There are 31-33 seniors this year. Sam Draper will reach out to the previous Banquet Chair to get information from last year. Chris will form and meet with a committee to plan to solidify plans. She will also look into having it in the CLHS Cafeteria. We would only have to pay for custodial services. The ticket prices will be determined by the expenses so the cost is not known yet.

- 6. Upcoming events
 - a. Megaband Jan 20th

Mr. Pearce was able to reserve the facilities for the event this year. It will be held in the gym and band hall. Megaband is a time for incoming 8th grade band students and high school band kids to play fun music and socialize and then perform for parents. The purpose is to promote band and get junior high kids interested before course selections. Booster club will have representatives there to promote band and answer questions for parents. The Booster Club will purchase pizza.

b. UIL Solo and Ensemble Contest – Feb 3rd (Hosting event, Student payment of \$12 by Jan 12th)
Lake is hosting the contest. Payments are due on January 12th. The cost is \$12 per student for Solo entries and \$12 per student for Ensemble entries. Mr. Pearce needs volunteers to feed judges. All Wind Ensemble students will have solos and all Ensembles will play.

c. Spring Trip – Feb 16th – 20^{th} (5^{th} payment due Jan 19^{th})

The itinerary will be coming out soon. Room assignments sign up will be at next payment Jan 19th for those who are up-to-date with payments.

7. Directors' Comments

Concert band rehearsals are beginning soon.

Region Band was in December and 35 students made Region Band. Ten of those students advanced to Area. Oliver Lampson placed first at Area and advanced to State for the 3rd time.

A new fundraiser selling coffee and tumblers will be starting tomorrow. Kids will be sending out text messages.
